Domaine Jacques Cacheux Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru La Croix Rameau 2014

94 points "A stunning nose of pure cherry, currant, flowers, cinnamon and sandalwood introduces this powerhouse red. The vibrant acidity and refined tannins lend support and the oak is deftly integrated. The potential is there, but this needs time. Best from 2023 through 2048." -B.S. (10/31/17)

Domaine Jacques Cacheux Grand Cru Échezeaux 2014

93 points "This spicy red is full of cherry and currant flavors, with a solid base of tannins and a firm finish. Austere at this stage, this gains richness with air and should expand even more with a little time. Best from 2022 through 2038." -B.S. (10/31/17)

Domaine Jacques Cacheux Chambolle-Musigny 1er Cru Les Plantes 2014

93 points "Pretty currant, cherry and floral aromas and flavors are matched by a fine matrix of tannins in this succulent red. Graphite and stone elements seep into the mix as this winds down on the long aftertaste. Best from 2020 through 2035." -B.S. (10/31/17)

Domaine Jacques Cacheux Vosne-Romanée Aux Réas 2014

93 points "A sumptuous, inviting style, this features floral, spice and a subtle vegetal aromas, followed by flavors of macerated cherry, smoke and stone. All the elements are lifted by vivid acidity, with refined tannins. The finish is long, showing precursors to the sweet fruit and spice elements that will develop with age. Best from 2023 through 2045." -B.S. (10/31/17)



Domaine Jacques Cacheux Grand Cru Échezeaux 2014

91 points "Distinct notes of oak and menthol can be found on the moderately ripe and spicy red and dark pinot fruit that are cut with hints of exotic tea. There is good richness to the solidly dense and relatively powerful medium-bodied flavors that are shaped by firm tannins on the dusty and borderline rustic finish. This is certainly no shrinking violet and a wine that's going to need at least a few years to come together because at present it could be fairly described as youthfully awkward. As such, I would recommend buying it only if you're prepared to cellar it for at least a few years first." -A.M. (6/11/17)

Domaine Jacques Cacheux Chambolle-Musigny 1er Cru Les Plantes 2014

91 points "Enough wood to comment on surrounds the attractively fresh and lightly spicy aromas of mostly red and dark pinot fruit where hints of plum and violet add depth. The delicious, vibrant and solidly well-detailed medium weight flavors exude a subtle minerality on the rich, sappy and moderately firm finish where the wood telegraphed by the nose resurfaces. To be sure the wood remains in the background and overall, this is really quite good and my sense is that it will need the better part of a decade to arrive at its peak. Worth a look." -A.M. (6/11/17)

Domaine Jacques Cacheux Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru La Croix Rameau 2014

90 points "This too exhibits enough wood to mention though the aromatic profile is much more restrained and quite somber with dark currant, earth and plum scents that are liberally laced by various spice elements. There is good verve to the delicious and attractively textured medium weight flavors that also display a bit of wood on the slightly austere and, somewhat curiously for the vintage, somewhat warm finale. As the description suggests, this is somewhat awkward today though I suspect that if it's allowed at least a few years of bottle age it should come together." -A.M. (6/11/17)
