Pierre Meurgey Savigny-lès-Beaune Les Bas Liards 2019

"Light and lilting, exhibiting strawberry, cherry, sandalwood, anise and mineral aromas and flavors. Silky and charming, with fine complexity, viscosity and length. Best from 2025 through 2038. 96 cases made, 25 cases imported." - *Bruce Sanderson (May 2023)*

Pierre Meurgey Pommard 1^{er} Cru Les Grands Epenots 2019

"Boasts an earthy, reductive aroma that gives way to black cherry, blackberry, cassis and violet flavors. Taut and linear, this persists on the finish, where a mineral streak and dense, dusty tannins reign. Mouthwatering. Be patient. Best from 2026 through 2045. 72 cases made, 25 cases imported." - *Bruce Sanderson (May 2023)*

Pierre Meurgey Beaune 1er Cru Les Valières 2019

"Sleek and racy, with wild cherry, currant and spices fused to a steely structure. On the austere side now, this shows persistence and grip on the minerally finish. Best from 2025 through 2042. 48 cases made, 25 cases imported." - Bruce Sanderson (May 2023)

Pierre Meurgey Beaune 1^{er} Cru Les Vignes Franches 2019

"Distinctly spicy, this red evokes cherry, currant, mineral and black pepper flavors. While aligned to a hard-edge structure, this remains balanced, with the fruit shining through on the finish. Best from 2025 through 2042. 48 cases made, 25 cases imported." - Bruce Sanderson (May 2023)







PIERRE MEURGEY

2020 Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru

Tasting note: "Here too there is a distinct coolness to the restrained aromas of essence of Granny Smith apples, wet stone, lemon-lime and soft spice wisps. There is fine mid-palate density and a lovely sense of underlying tension to the succulent yet powerful larger-scaled flavors that conclude in a moderately austere and sneaky long finale. This too could use better depth, but the underlying material appears to be present for that to occur." -Allen Meadows (June 2022)

PIERRE MEURGEY

2020 Pernand-Vergelesses "Sous Frétille" 1er Cru

Tasting note: "Subtle but still easily perceptible aromas include those of mineral reduction, cool citrus and a variety of white fleshed fruit. The racy, intense and beautifully delineated medium-bodied flavors also exude a discreet minerality on the chiseled, lemony and bone-dry finale. Be sure to let this cellar for at least a few years as it could use a bit more depth; also worth considering." -Allen Meadows (June 2022)

2020 Beaune Cuvée Les Valières 1er Cru

Note: from Les Cras and Blanches Fleurs

Tasting note: "A slightly riper nose exhibits more floral influence, especially violet, on the dark berry fruit scents. I very much like the texture of the solidly concentrated medium-bodied flavors that are shaped by relatively fine-grained tannins on the balanced and impressively persistent finale. Note that this well-structed effort should reward up to a decade of keeping." -Allen Meadows (June 2022)

PIERRE MEURGEY

2020 Pommard "Les Grands Epenots" 1er Cru

91 points

Tasting note: "This is riper still though not so much that it loses freshness on the black cherry liqueur aromas that display background nuances of cassis, anise and violet. There is better verve and freshness on the palate of the medium weight plus flavors that possess excellent density on the suave yet powerful, sappy and youthfully austere finale. This is very much built-to-age and a wine that's going to need at least 6 to 8 years first." -Allen Meadows (June 2022)
