Trentenare IGP Paestum Fiano 2014

90 points

“Bright pale yellow. Tangy aromas of lemon and orange zest, minerals and fresh herbs. Bright flavors of stone fruit and pear are focused and long. A hint of saline minerality and an edge of acidity give the wine outstanding cut. Despite spending six months on its lees, this wine shows no hazelnutty, yeasty or buttery notes. A remarkably good, seductively drinkable entry-level Fiano di Avellino.” -I.D.

Pian di Stio IGP Paestum Fiano 2014

“Vivid straw-yellow. Cool, deep aromas of pear, apricot and white flowers. Enters the mouth supple and open-knit, then displays sneaky concentration and verve, with harmonious acidity providing spine and focus to the orchard fruit and mineral flavors. A repeating floral character lingers long on the complex, bright finish. This is very enjoyable now but should make for a lovely drink over the next four or five years. It shares a strong family resemblance to the entry-level Fiano Trentenare but is much denser and a distinct step up in concentration and depth. The wine’s name derives from a vineyard located roughly 550 meters above sea level near Stio in the Cilento national park. Made without any oak.” -I.D.
