LEGIT is made from Cabernet Sauvignon grapes grown in Tolaini's San Giovanni vineyard in the heart of Castelnuovo Berardenga, Tuscany. This wine is bottled as a single varietal to showcase its unique harmony of distinct terroir, robust bright fruit and lush round tannins

After careful selection, the grapes are destemmed and placed in French oak fermenters where frequent remontage takes place over a period of 30 days.

Malolactic fermentation follows in French oak barriques (70% new and 30% used once). The wine is aged for 24 months in barriques, and rests on the lees for 6 months of this time.

Lia Tolaini Banville's collaboration with the Monk family began in 2016 when she was tasting barrels of the 2013 Cabernet with a colleague at Tolaini. They agreed this wine was a LEGIT Cabernet Sauvignon, with a true sense of place and an Italian soul. In wanting to pursue the name LEGIT, only one person came to mind. A person who embodied stylish originality and eternal hipness, an artist referred to as the "Genius of Modern Music" – Thelonious Monk.
